#### **COURSE CO-ORDINATOR'S REPORT:**

This term we have nine speakers who have offered their time to come and talk to us. As you would expect, their topics are as many and varied as they are interesting, so I hope that you are able to come along and enjoy their presentations.

First off will be Muriel Blowes who will talk about *Africa* and in particular *Zimbabwe*. This country is often in the news, so to hear more about its history will add to our understanding of the current situation.

Tony Thomson's talk on *The Electricity Industry* is quite timely given the current debate on that very subject. Power generation concerns us all, if only the cost! How power is generated and what of the future of power generation is an important topic to discuss.

*Indian Numerology* by Jahne Peart takes us into world of mathematics – in a small way - to reveal your destiny; your path in life and your journey which has been mapped out.

Rosemary and Tony Wheals have lived in *Japan* and will share that experience with us. Using a slide show Rosemary and Tony will cover the unique aspects of Japanese life, as they witnessed it over the several months of their visits.

Chinese rulers tried to ban the trade. Two short wars took place as Britain imposed free trade.
