Since Australians spend on average more than 80 per cent of their time indoors, it is the in-door environment that can be the cause of major health problems. This talk explores the sources of air pollution indoors, from cats to stoves. A range of pollutants, both gases and particle matter, are assessed and their potential health impacts reviewed. In many situations, it is the indoor atmosphere that can cause respiratory problems, rather than pollutants encountered in the outdoor environment. Management suggestions for the indoor environment are included.

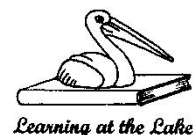
