**Mon, 13 Oct: The Whistle Blower:** (1986) 100 mins. British thriller. Michael Caine, James Fox, Nigel Havers, John Gielgud. A middle-aged intelligence officer, (Caine), whose son, (Havers), is a Russian linguist and translator, is devastated to learn that his son is dead. "Accidental death" is the official verdict. The father embarks on his own investigation and discovers there are no limits to what the government will do to protect its secrets. When he finally discovers the truth, he takes matters into his own hands in a sensational climax.

**Mon, 27 Oct: Call Northside 777:** The true story of a reporter who corrects a miscarriage of justice. Eleven years after Frank Wiecek, (Richard Conte), is jailed for murdering a police officer, his mother runs an ad offering \$5000 for information about the real killer. Newspaper editor, (Lee J Cobb), assigns reporter, (James Stewart), to investigate the story, and he soon gathers evidence which leads him to believe Wiecek is innocent.

**Mon, 10 Nov: Love Me or Leave Me:** (1955) 117 mins. A 1955 biographical musical drama film which tells the life story of Ruth Etting, a singer who rose from dancer to movie star. Doris Day plays Etting, James Cagney is gangster Martin "Moe the Gimp" Snyder, her first husband and manager, and Cameron Mitchell is pianist/arranger Myrl Alderman, her second husband.

**Mon 24 Nov: All My Sons:** (1948) 94 mins. A compelling and heartbreaking story about family ties, patriotic duty and personal greed. Edward G Robinson is a manufacturer of aircraft parts for the military during WW11. Burt Lancaster is his son who is determined to marry the daughter of the ex-partner, who's has been jailed for shipping defective parts, resulting in the deaths of 21 pilots.

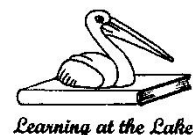
