Cognitive Behaviour Therapy (or "CBT") originated in the 1960s and its use has blossomed since the 1980s. CBT offers techniques and strategies that can be used to change unhelpful patterns of thought and behaviour. These techniques are used to assist people with a wide range of mental and behavioural problems such as depression, anxiety, panic attacks, anger, or low self-esteem, but they can be useful to many of us in dealing with unwanted habits.

ROOM CHANGES AT DIGGERS

Members may be puzzled about the recent room changes at the diggers club.

It seems that management decided to convert the two rooms we had been using into one large room, solely for the use of the members of the internal snooker club.

The decision was made without any consultation with either the staff of diggers, or any of the groups who previously used the rooms.

We were only made aware of the situation when one of our groups arrived to find they had been locked out.

We have been offered the use of the National Servicemen's Room, and hope to be able to make use of this facility for the remainder of this year for many of our classes. However, this room is not always available, and some classes will be held in either the Pavilion Room or adjacent to Bites eatery (see note attached to this Newsletter). Also, the room is available on only one Monday each month, so the Play Reading Group will now meet at the Long Jetty Uniting Church Hall, conveniently situated opposite the diggers club.

We are extremely grateful to the staff of diggers, who have made every effort to help in this situation, and also to the members of the National Servicemen's club, who have kindly agreed to share their room with us. We ask our members to please ensure that the room is left in a clean and tidy state, and that all tables and chairs are returned to the places where they were found.

The committee is working constantly to ensure that these changes are not too disruptive. There is no guarantee that things will remain as they are at present, but we will attempt to advise members if and when we are told of any changes.
