## DID YOU KNOW?

U3A is an international movement which provides low cost educational activities, in a relaxed environment, for people who are retired or semi-retired. The first age of your life is receiving your education and the second is pursuing a career and/or raising a family. The third age (3A) is said to commence after 'active employment', and is probably the best. It is the time to pursue those ambitions and dreams for which there has been no previous opportunity, and to enlarge your personal horizons.

U3A was founded in Toulouse (France) in 1972 based on academic programs run by the University. The concept was modified in Cambridge UK in the 1980s by Dr Peter Laslett, and the programs were run independently of academic involvement. U3A reached Australia in 1984, and was based on the UK system. In Australia U3A offers retired people the chance to participate at an affordable outlay. There are no exams, and where possible, course leaders are from within U3A's own membership.

John di Gravio has been with Newcastle University's Archives section for over 20 years. He has been head Archivist since 2005, and Chair of the Coal River Working Party (HHi) since 2008.

At present he is working to combine cultural heritage with the training up of young people to create a national employment apprenticeship/traineeship scheme, very similar to what was in place during the industrial age, that will bring young people (and the young at heart) in contact with the archival materials of human expression covering thousands of years and into the technological and digital data age.

During the late 18th and the 19th centuries, people were keen on collecting ancient artifacts. There was a law forbidding the removal of these objects from the country of origin but that made them all the more valuable to those selling them. The Elgin Marbles were among some of these collectables.

These were marble sculptures from the Parthenon on the Acropolis in Athens. They are housed in the British Museum, London, and landed there via Lord Elgin who was a British diplomat from Scotland stationed in Greece. There is great controversy surrounding these treasures and that is the topic of these two talks.
