Cassandra has been with NorthConnex for the past 18 months as part of the Community Team, which keeps the community informed about construction work on the project. Cassandra will provide an overview of NorthConnex, which is a \$3 billion underground motorway linking the Hills M2 Motorway at West Pennant Hills and the M1 Pacific Motorway at Wahroonga.

#### **NORTHCONNEX (Continued)**

Currently, there are 20 roadheaders on the project, which are used to excavate sandstone and shale from the tunnel alignment. Around mid this year, tunnelling excavation will be completed and the tunnel fit out teams will focus on making the tunnel ready for road users in late 2019. The presentation will include photos and videos from underground to show what work goes on about 60 metres beneath Pennant Hills Road.
