The Cuban Missile Crisis Part 1

A 35-day (16 October – 20 November 1962) confrontation between the United States and the Soviet Union, in Cuba. The confrontation is often considered the closest the Cold War came to escalating into a full-scale nuclear war.

The talk uses multi-media to take you through the events and reveals how close the world came to nuclear war. It includes discussions with world leaders, extracts from the film about it. This was the most serious confrontation between East and West during the cold war and President Kennedy's first big decision. With the current situation in Ukraine, it is very relevant and explains why the West does not want to force the Russians into using any type of nuclear weapons.
