Monday, 24 July, 2023: THE GHOSTWRITER: 2010 (124 mins) Ewan McGregor, Pierce Brosnan, Kim Cattrall, Olivia Williams. When a gifted ghostwriter (McGregor) is hired to write the memoirs of former British Prime Minister, Adam Lang (Brosnan), he finds himself entrapped in a web of political and sexual intrigue. As he digs into Lang's past, he discovers secrets that threaten to jeopardise international relations forever.

Monday, 14 August, 2023: RESISTANCE: 2020 (2hrs) Jesse Eisenberg. Before he was Marcel Marceau, he was Marcel Mangel, an aspiring Jewish actor who joined the French Resistance to save the lives of thousands of children orphaned at the hands of the Nazis. Marcel had no intention of getting involved with the war, but his life was thrown into upheaval when he was recruited to put his acting skills to the ultimate test, teaching Jewish orphans to survive the horrifying reality of the Holocaust. Monday, 28 August, 2023: MRS HARRIS GOES TO PARIS: 2002 (151 mins): Lesley Manville, Isabella Huppert, Lambert Wilson, Ellen Thomas, Jason Isaacs. A heart-warming tale about London housecleaner, Ada Harris, who thinks her lonely life might turn around if she can become the owner of a Christian Dior gown. Saying goodbye to friends like Archie, (Jason Isaacs) won't be easy, and neither will be winning over elite people in Paris like Madame Colbert, (Isabelle Huppert), but Ada's irrepressible charm might end up saving the whole House of Dior in this uplifting story of how an ordinary woman becomes an extraordinary inspiration by daring to follow her dreams.

Monday, 11 September, 2023: THE BOOKSHOP: 2017 (113 mins) Emily Mortimer, Bill Nighy, Patricia Clarkson. In 1959 Florence Green, (Mortimer), a free-spirited widow, puts grief behind her and risks everything to open a bookshop in the sleepy seaside town of Hardborough, England. By exposing the narrow-minded locals to the best literature of the day, including "LOLITA" and "FAHRENHEIT 451", she causes a cultural awakening in a town which has not changed for centuries. She finds an ally in Mr Brundish, (Nighy), but an enemy in Mrs Gamart, (Clarkson), the town's vengeful, embittered alpha female, a wannabe doyenne of the local arts scene.

PLAYING CARDS

The Chinese invented playing cards in AD 1000.

Some interesting facts and observations about "Playing cards":

Did you know that the Traditional Deck of Playing Cards are a strikingly coherent form of a Calendar?

There are 52 weeks in the year and there are 52 Playing Cards in a Deck.

There are 13 weeks in each Season and there are 13 cards in each suit.

There are 4 Seasons in a Year and 4 Suits in the Deck.

There are 12 Months in a Year so there are 12 Court Cards (Those with faces namely Jack, Queen, King in each suit)

If you let Jacks = 11, Queens = 12, and the Kings = 13, then add up all the sums of 1 + 2 + 3 + ... to 13 = 91.

Multiply this by 4, for the 4 Suits, therefore $91 \times 4 = 364$.

Add 1 that is the Joker and you will arrive at the number 365 being the Days in a Year.

Life of a "Rat of Tobruk"

In this talk we will follow a foot soldier from the joining of the UK army in 1939 in England through Palestine, Egypt, Libya. Helping Montgomery to fight with the Allies in the desert, then becoming a "Rat of Tobruk", defeating Rommel at El Alemain, invading Sicily, and eventually guarding POWs in Italy.

We will hear how this 18 year old became an adult in the most brutal of wars, managed to have a relationship by mail, squeezed in a wedding between battles and lived to tell the tale and immigrate to Australia with the help of the mother of his best Australian mate who he saw die in Tobruk. Voluntary Assisted Dying

Voluntary Assisted Dying is the limited legal right to have a doctor help you die quickly and painlessly at a time of your choosing. Every Australian State now has a VAD law. In NSW, it will come into effect late in 2023. This talk will cover why VAD is now legal, who will be eligible to use the law, and what processes they will need to follow. It will describe the experience of the law in other States, the NSW Department of Health's plans for the introduction of the law, and how "Dying With Dignity NSW" is helping.
