From the President:

A Special Meeting of the Association was held on 25 June at which your Committee's recommendations to become incorporated and join the NSW Council of U3A Inc was carried unanimously. Charles Condell has agreed to be our Public Officer and is coordinating a lot of the work. Elaine Callan will assume the role of Welfare Officer in addition to being Vice President.

On incorporation, we become a legal entity under the auspices of the Department of Fair Trading. In order to do so, we have to comply with a number of requirements which include taking out insurance and modifying the Department's Model Rules to include our own aims and objectives.

Once incorporated, our Branch of the U3A, to be known as U3A Tuggerah Lakes (NSW) Inc, will join the NSW Council of U3A Inc. This is a well-organised group with regular Newsletters and annual seminars but, most importantly, group insurance at special rates.

At the moment we have no insurance and our Treasurer has not been able to find any insurer willing to offer cover. While we do come under Wyong Council's insurance, if using their premises, individual members could still be sued by their insurer for negligence. The same applies when using RSL Club premises.

Once insured, our Group will be able to run courses at other venues and to include outings, with all liabilities covered. There will be an initial charge to become incorporated as well as the annual membership fee for the NSW Council. The Committee regards these costs as essential. But please note that these measures will not cost you any more – we now have more than adequate funds and income from the regular annual fee to pay these extra costs.

We start decentralising in Term 4 (starting 15 October) when we hope to have June Goss talking some more about her experiences in Russia at a new location, namely Wyong RSL, which has been chosen because of its accessibility to both bus and train
