FROM THE PRESIDENT:

The Social Day on 30th May attracted some forty members and proved a great opportunity for us to meet and to get to know each other better. The thirty minute video of extracts from Morecambe and Wise (prepared by Jayne Davis) was remarkably entertaining and brought back enjoyable memories.

I have just looked quickly at our Term 2 Calendar and was surprised to count twelve different activities. Considering the modest size of our group, this is a commendable achievement and a credit to our Course Co-ordinator and Committee and a reflection of the energy and imagination of those involved. Most of these activities are under the control of our own members, but a few involve folk or organisations outside our group such as guest speakers (some of whom may belong to other U3A groups).

It is a challenge to find new activities as well as interesting talks and speakers or leaders. It is perhaps timely that we have recently been reminded that help is available from sources external to our own members.

We have just been informed that U3A Network (NSW) has collected together information on about thirty different courses. This is freely available to potential course leaders of groups (or to individuals who may wish to work on their own).  Suspense (103 mins.) Van Johnson, Vera Miles, Cecil Parker. Blind playwright Johnson is determined to thwart plans for a crime which he overhears being planned in a London pub.

13th Aug: LIFE IS BEAUTIFUL: (1998) Winner of Academy Awards for Best Actor, Best Foreign Film, Best Music (116 mins) An unforgettable and deeply-moving story of a man's love for his family, and how he uses his imagination to save them.

27th Aug: SABRINA: (1954) Romance (109 mins). Audrey Hepburn, Humphrey Bogart, William Holden. Bogart and Holden are mega-rich brothers, Audrey is their gardener's daughter. When she returns from Paris all grown-up, both brothers fall under her spell.
