Bigoted soldier Robert Ryan allows the blame to fall on another soldier too drunk to remember where he was, and his fate rests in the hands of dance-hall girl, Gloria Grahame.

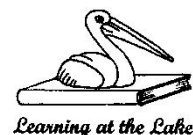
