**TRACING YOUR BRITISH ANCESTORS:****MONDAY**

John's talk will show how you can use the Internet to trace your British (English, Welsh and Scottish) ancestors back through time, in particular from around 1900 back to 1750 or even earlier. The live Internet session will be projected onto the big screen. If members would like to bring the name of a British grandparent (or earlier), the year of birth or marriage or the place where they lived, those details may be used when demonstrating the search methods. John also has some tips on tracing NSW ancestors (and some other Australian ancestors).

Gwen Dundon is an author with six books to her credit, all centred on the Central Coast. It is her latest book, A History of Ferries on the Central Coast which will be the focus of her talk to us. Gwen reminds us that ferries

were very important before good roads came to the area. "When railways came through, a great many people came up from Sydney for holidays and the ferries were used to get people around".

The history covers the time punts were used on the waterways and continues to include the use of oil powered launches at the end of the 1900s. Ferry services that operated in Brisbane Waters up to about the mid-70s and services that ran between The Entrance North, The Entrance, Long Jetty and over to Wyong are covered in Gwen's presentation.

The tour includes memorials at Passchendaele, Tyne-Cot, Hill 60, Langemark, Villers Bretonneux, Bullecourt, the site of the 'Christmas Truce' and Lochnagar Crater on the Somme, as well as the new memorial under construction (at that time) at Fromelles and the WW2 beaches of Normandy.


