FROM THE PRESIDENT:

Greetings to fellow members! We have reached the half-way point for the year, with two terms completed and two remaining. As usual, our Course Co-ordinator, Gloria Watson, has arranged a varied and interesting program of talks for Term 3, as shown later in this newsletter. After expressions of interest from several members, a new group - German Conversation - will start up towards the end of the Term.

Everything appears to be running smoothly, but... appearances are deceptive. Currently, your Committee has eight members (ideally we need ten). After giving their time willingly for several years, four Committee members have warned that other commitments will prevent them from continuing with their current duties beyond the end of this year. In addition, the Treasurer must also stand down under the three year rule unless we amend our Constitution. Unless new volunteers step forward to join the Committee, we will have no Program Co-ordinator, no Publicity Officer, no Secretary, no Welfare Officer and possibly no Treasurer. Could we continue to operate?

What does being on the Committee involve? Your Committee has five meetings each year, to deal with general matters and to finalise the program for each term. We simply sit around a table and discuss the issues. So at minimum, being on the Committee involves 10 - 15 hours work a year. Most Committee members also take on an additional role, such as Membership Officer or Publicity Officer (which involve an average of no more than 1 hour a week). Some other roles do involve more time, such as Program Co-ordinator (which might average 2 or 3 hours a week, much like the Treasurer). Please think about joining the Committee. If you might be willing to help in this way, have a chat with any of the Committee members, or give me a call.

Many of the hours given to our U3A are given by members who are not on the Committee. They run interest groups (Walking, French, Reading, Singing, etc) or prepare and give talks, etc. We recently conducted a survey to estimate the total number of hours given by members in the last 12 months towards running and operating our U3A. The result?... about 1800 hours, contributed by about 20 people (i.e about one member in seven)

Our third visitor for the term is Howard Bridgman who gives of his academic expertise in a very down-to-earth and thoroughly enjoyable manner. His topic on this occasion is 'Droughts and Flooding Rains'. I suggest that we will all gain greater insight of these perennial events in our country from Howard's undoubted knowledge of the area.

Members who will kindly give of their time and knowledge include Trevor Kruger who is right into sense, no scents, actually 'Making Sense of Scents' is his topic. The first of three sessions, Trevor will, on this occasion, have us thinking about smells. Unusual? And what if you don't smell? Perhaps I should say, can't smell, yes that sounds nicer. Well, Trevor will have all the answers.

Pam McGlenn gives us another fascinating look back on our history on these occasions to William Bligh and Lachlan Macquarie. Rita Richards goes even further back and further afield with King Tutankhamun and the Princes in the Tower. Mystery abounds and perhaps even murder.

A new-comer to the presentations is Doreen Morley. Her topic is one which we all without exception are headed towards. Yes it's the old coming to grips with destiny: death! But is it to be feared? Doreen asks us to look more closely at the world in which we live to ascertain the reality of life after death. Fascinating.

If you look to broadening your understanding of life as it is, what has come before and, perhaps, what is to come after, come along to Term 3 talks.

**SOCIAL DAY TUESDAY 28th JUNE**

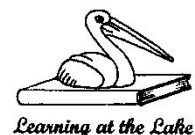
