FROM THE PRESIDENT:

So many things in life have beginnings and endings, just like the classes we offer at our U3A.

From the beginning of the new term, the group will be meeting at 'diggers' on Monday afternoons (see detailed program).

Sadly, another of our groups is closing down, at least for the time being. Two years ago, Margaret Goode started "Singing for Fun", and many of us have been along to enjoy singing old favourites. But recently, numbers attending have dwindled, and the pianist is unable to attend next term. Many thanks for running this group, Margaret, and for all the photocopying you have done so everyone would have the words of the songs!

As we pass through life, we learn rules of thumb that simplify our decision-making. We categorise things and people and put them into mental boxes. These are useful tools, but if we are not careful, we become lazy, using these short-cuts even when they are not appropriate, to avoid the need to think.

There is probably some truth in these generalisations, but they are not true for everyone, as well we know. Many a young person lacks energy, enthusiasm or adventure. And many an older person is active, interested and in reasonably good health.

What matters most is attitude of mind. Just as practising smiling or laughing, even as a pretence, can make you feel happier, so practicing seeing yourself as active and involved will help you become more active and involved.

We U3A-ers are willing to learn. Let's hope that enough of us are also willing to become involved and on the Committee. Your Committee needs you! Yes, you! Please put your name forward before the AGM in December!

COURSE CO-ORDINATOR'S REPORT:

It has been a varied year with presentations on a wide range of topics. The final term of the year is perhaps a little more relaxed with only eight presentations.

Member Trevor Kruger will return on two occasions to speak further 'On Being Human'. His first presentation, "A Matter of Taste" asks questions such as, 'Is taste determined by taste buds or the brain?' Members are invited to have their own questions on taste to put to Trevor.

Later in the term Trevor returns with 'Touch' or 'Once Again with Feeling' to have us think about pain, "Can pain be reduced, or increased, by belief?"

A visitor, Ralph Seccombe, will tell us about the joys, and I have no doubt, the woes, of manning nineteenth century sailing ships, i.e. square riggers. Ralph will be joined by Jocelyn Webster who next year is actually going to be part of the crew on HBD Endeavour. What an experience!

Ralph suggests that you could take yourself to Sydney during the summer and visit the 'James Craig' which after a working life of sixty years is now part of the Sydney Heritage Fleet.

Think of this series of talks as perhaps the catalyst for Christmas reading, thinking, "Hmm, I didn't know that, but now that I do, I just might find out some more for myself."

A visitor from Gosford U3A, Jean Witherall will present to us a side of our early history of which few of us may be aware, that is the situation of women. Jean's talk is titled 'A Cargo So Unnecessary' which doesn't sound too promising for those first female convict settlers. Find out if their lot differed from their male counterparts.

Eva Seale finishes the presentations for the year by continuing her reminiscence of her European River Cruise.

After a working life of some sixty years, going round Cape Horn 23 times, the ship lay derelict until rescue and a wonderful restoration effort, largely by volunteers of the Sydney Heritage Fleet.

Jocelyn Webster who will be sailing on the HMB Endeavour next year will add to the talk by sharing some of her sailing experiences with us. There will be a demonstration of stowing a square-sail and an explanation of the term square-rigger.


